### SIG Update

Security SIG Report 25th April 2007

Another well attended security SIG started with a Safeguard update from Iain Liston Brown (HP). Much debate surrounded HP's intention to only apply new functionality to the Itanium version of Safeguard leaving the S series pretty much as it is. Then was the first of two presentations looking at penetration testing. The first by Colin Yates of TCM focused on external prevention of service attacks and threw up some interesting scenarios. This topic was further discussed by Michael Jones of Brightstrand who looked at internal and external hacking. Dave Russell (HP) warmed us all up to the first presentation of the afternoon on e-payment security. Dave covered various new terminology and paved the way for John Petersen from Validsoft who gave a live demo that had everyone startled as to just how easy 'man in the middle' and 'man in the browser' attacks are to put into affect. The day was then rounded off by vendor updates from Comforte, XYPRO and Ross Systems. Huge thanks to all of the speakers and also to HP for the venue, and refreshments.
